May your time with us be full of learning, friendships and fun. We warmly welcome you and your families to our school community.

During the holiday we had some renovations done in the Library building, with the open spaces being converted into classrooms in order to accommodate an increase in numbers. At the moment our enrolments are 168 children from Reception through to Year 6. Thank you

to those in our community who obviously speak positively about our school to others. Most of our enrolments come due to the effect of 'word of mouth'. With the renovations now complete we have moved our senior students across into the Library building. I want to thank our staff for their patience in waiting for these rooms to be complete before they could move in. I also want to thank them for the great deal of work they had to do in the move, relocating furniture and other items.

On Tuesday 13th February (Shrove Tuesday) we will hold a 'Meet the Teacher' evening. This is the opportunity for our teachers to outline their expectations, routines and plans for the year ahead. 
The Year 5/6's have been exploring, 'What it means to have a great learning community'. We have begun to discuss what elements help our learning community to be successful through the lens of our learning vision:






Why is this important?

Ready, Set, Progress

Playgroup SA has partnered with the Office for the Early Years (Department of Education) to provide free development checks for children aged 12 months to 4 years. The checks provide an important opportunity to monitor your child's development, identify any concerns and celebrate milestones. A <u>development</u> check helps to monitor whether a child is meeting the milestones for their age (such as dressing or talking). Please note this is <u>not</u> a health check.

What does the check screen?

The development check looks at the following areas: communication, movement, problem solving and personal-social skills.

Why do a developmental check?

When concerns about a child's development are identified early and appropriate support is given, children have the best chance of developing the skills they need for playing, interacting and learning. This gives them the best chance of reaching their potential.

How will you screen my child?

We will be using the Ages and Stages Questionnaires (ASQ-3) to monitor your child's developmental milestones. This questionnaire is parent friendly and will be sent home to be completed over a 1 week period. A child development facilitator will talk with you individually about the questionnaire on the following visit and will be able to help you answer any questions if you were not able to complete it.

What do I need to do?

- · Attend playgroup on given date
- Sign a consent form and take home the questionnaire provided at play group on given date
- Complete the questionnaire at home
- Attend the playgroup with completed questionnaire on given date
- Follow through with any referrals or recommendations, if needed.
